A degree in Spanish prepares students to live and work in a competitive, interdependent world. Mount Mary students develop literacy in global matters, multiculturalism and cultural diversity, while developing language proficiency and becoming contributing members of our global society.

Mount Mary offers small, interactive classes conducive to world language learning. The program fosters critical thinking and intellectual growth and augments students' appreciation of varied literature and civilizations. Using a communicative approach to teaching, instructors often use role-playing to place students in real-life situations where they must not only know the language, but also understand cultural variables that can impact intercultural communication.

Spanish Major

Mount Mary's Spanish major is designed to develop the student's ability to understand, speak, read and write Spanish, as well as comprehend and analyze culture and literature. A Spanish minor is also available.

Post-Baccalaureate Certificate

Mount Mary offers a Spanish post-baccalaureate certificate for students who have already earned a bachelor's degree.
