**Mount Mary College Marian Gallery to Open Painting Exhibit**  
*Works represent artist's narrative images*

**MILWAUKEE** (October 23, 2012) – “These Places Have Their Moments,” an exhibit featuring 25 paintings by Bruce Moon, will be on display Sunday, November 3, 2012 through Saturday, November 24, 2012 in Mount Mary College’s Marian Art Gallery. An artist’s opening reception will take place Saturday, November 3, 2012 from 4:30 – 6:30 p.m. The event is free and open to the public.

Moon’s painting career spans over 40 years. He began working in realistic renderings and later moved into abstract expressionism and surrealism. In the past 20 years, Moon has drawn inspiration from the imagery of untrained artists he met while working as an art therapist with the mentally ill. Their painted stories inspired Moon to create his own. This exhibit includes two of his early paintings that were created in the studio of small private psychiatric hospital where he and patients told their stories through art.
